Dear Parent/ Carers,

With the support from the Brentwood Catholic Children's Society, we have been able to organise a parental workshop with **Calley Dickinson (Child and Adolescent Counsellor)** as our guest speaker. The focus of the workshop is **'Tune in with your teen.'**

Below is an outline from Calley of what will be covered in the workshop:

Adolescence can be an incredibly difficult time, not just for teenagers but also for their parents and carers.

It is a period of enormous change, presenting multiple challenges and pressures as well as offering many opportunities. For parents, it can feel like you are entering uncharted territory; your child's behaviour can seem unpredictable, distant and uncommunicative one minute, demanding and "needy" the next. It can be a confusing, worrying and somewhat lonely time, leaving you struggling to know how to support your child.

This 1-hour workshop will inform, encourage and support you in exploring:  
What goes on in our child's brain during adolescence, and how this affects behaviour.  
How acknowledging the challenges this presents can help you to understand and be attentive to your teen's needs.

Effective strategies you can use to improve communication with your teen as you negotiate your changing relationship.

The workshop will take place on **Thursday 27th November from 9.30-10.40am**. If you would like to attend, please use the form below to sign up.

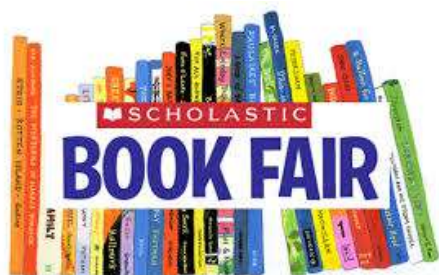

## Student Leadership News

### Launch of the Student Leadership Training Programme

Our Student Leadership Training Programme started this month with an inspiring session led by our **Chair of Governors, Mrs Doves**. The student leaders assembled in the boardroom and were joined by Mrs Doves virtually via Microsoft Teams.

The focus of the afternoon was on what makes a good leader and the values that guide leadership. Despite the physical distance, her message was engaging, encouraging and especially relevant to the responsibilities our young leaders are stepping into.

She talked about several qualities that help leaders make a positive impact, including kindness, open communication, and acting responsibly. Mrs Doves also highlighted the importance of Ursuline values, encouraging students to think about how these can be applied in everyday school life, whether through involvement in clubs, supporting others, or how they represent the school.

As part of understanding what makes a strong leader, the session also looked at ethical leadership. Students heard about the importance of being clear and transparent, making decisions with integrity, even when it's difficult, leading by example, and speaking up when necessary.

The session gave students plenty to think about as they begin their leadership roles this year.

### This is what some of our students had to say...

In the first session of our new training programme on Wednesday, Mrs. Doves, the Chair of the School Governors, spoke about the importance of teamwork and shared practical advice on leading with integrity and responsibility.

The best part was discussing different scenarios and exploring what we would do in each one. It was interesting to hear how differently people approach situations. The session was highly informative and gave us valuable insights into effective leadership and how to guide a group with confidence and fairness.

Mrs Doves highlighted the value of effective teamwork and offered thoughtful guidance on leading without compromising your own values and a sense of responsibility. She solidified our values as a team and challenged our critical thinking. The most engaging part of the session was working through a range of scenarios and discussing how we might respond to each one. It was fascinating to see the variety of perspectives and approaches within the group.

## Did you know...just registering your daughter for Free School Meals means that our school gets extra money!!

You can register your daughter for Free School Meals if you receive any of these benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
  - Income Support
    - Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
    - Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
  - Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
    - The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

If you want your daughter to have a free, healthy meal at lunchtime that's great – she will get a free meal (saving you more than £400 per year!). There is NO stigma attached and no one will know because we operate a cashless payment system in our Dining Hall.

If you qualify but don't want your daughter to have Free School Meals, please still register as the school will get additional funding. Your daughter can still continue to have her packed lunch as normal!

To apply please complete the on-line Free School Meals application on the [Redbridge.gov.uk](http://Redbridge.gov.uk) website. You can apply regardless of which borough you live in because your daughter attends a school in Redbridge. It is a simple 1-page form, so don't delay, apply today!!

It is important to note that:

- Taking the meal is recommended but not compulsory
- Your daughter may receive additional help as a result of being registered, for example, help with the cost of music lessons or school trips
- No one will know and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming
- Registering your daughter for Free School Meals will bring in more money to our school.
