Headteacher's Headlines



On 1st February we mark the feast of St Brigid, one of Ireland's patron saints. As an Irish woman, this is a day I celebrate with particular affection. St Brigid's life reminds us of the importance of generosity, hospitality and care for those most in need, values close to our hearts here at UAI. I shall be making St. Brigid's crosses with my family on Sunday.

I am particularly proud of how our students engage with complex and challenging themes. Across Year 7 and Year 8, students responded thoughtfully and creatively to work on peer pressure, misogyny and justice. Their writing, artwork and discussion show a growing awareness of their responsibilities to themselves and to others, and a willingness to stand against attitudes that undermine human dignity.

There are also many examples of students contributing positively to wider school life. The PE winter walk demonstrated commitment, teamwork and generosity, raising valuable funds for the department. Our participation in National Storytelling Week highlights the importance we place on reading, writing and student voice, while the Jack Petchey award reminds us of the impact student leadership can have when it is used for the benefit of others.

Together, these examples reflect our commitment to Catholic Social Teaching through respect for human dignity, responsibility for the common good, and the formation of young people who are attentive to justice, service and care for others.

SERVIAM

Ofsted has introduced a new grading system for schools, moving away from the previous four-grade model. Instead of giving one overall judgement, inspectors now provide a multi-area report card, offering a more rounded picture of how a school is performing across several key areas.

Schools are now graded using the following categories: Exceptional, Strong Standard, Expected Standard, Needs Attention, Urgent Improvement.

These categories are not comparable with the old grades because the inspection approach has changed significantly.

What Each Grade Means for Parents

Expected Standard

This is the national benchmark. A school meeting the expected standard is doing everything it should to ensure children receive a high-quality education. This is a strong and positive judgement, shown in green on the Ofsted report card.

Strong Standard

A grade showing that the school is consistently delivering excellent practice that is making a clear difference for children and learners.

Exceptional

This is a higher bar than the former 'outstanding' grade. It is only awarded when inspectors see practice that is among the very best in the country—approaches that should be shared nationally to help other schools improve.

Needs Attention

This is not a negative judgement. Instead, it signals that certain areas need focused development so the school can reach the expected standard. It is a constructive signal that targeted work is needed and is not the same as the previously used grade of 'requires improvement'.

Urgent Improvement

Used when more serious issues require immediate action.

Feast Day Celebration– Friday 23rd January

The Feast Day of St Angela Merici was a deeply meaningful and enriching occasion for us as an Ursuline community. Students in Years 8, 10 and 11 attended Mass at our local parish, St Peter and Paul, while Years 7, 9 and the Sixth Form gathered for a school Mass on site, presided over by Bishop Alan Willams, Bishop of Brentwood.

It was a great privilege for a school to welcome its bishop, and we are deeply grateful that he chose to share this important day with us. In his homily, Bishop Alan reflected on Christ the Good Shepherd, explaining that the crozier symbolises care, guidance and protection. He reminded us that true leadership is found in humble service. This message reflected the Gospel chosen for the day from Mark 9:34–37, where Jesus teaches that whoever wants to be first must be the servant of all. By placing a child at the centre, Jesus shows us that welcoming and caring for others—especially the youngest—is at the heart of Christian life.

St Angela Merici lived this spirit through her lifelong dedication to young people. Inspired by this celebration, our community is renewed in its commitment to lead with faith, humility and compassion.

Bishop Alan officially blessed our chapel after the Mass, following its recent decoration. This was indeed a joyful and memorable celebration for our school.

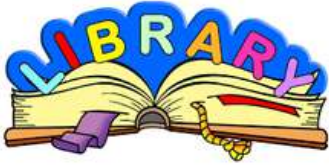

Library News

As part of the National Year of Reading – an initiative launched by the Department of Education and the National Literacy Trust to encourage reading for pleasure in 2026 – next week the UK will celebrate National Storytelling Week. From Monday February 2nd to Sunday February 8th, children and adults alike are urged to pick up a pen and embrace the art of storytelling. This celebration of writing is particularly important as research shows the number of young people engaging with creative writing for enjoyment is at an all-time low.

At UAI, we recognise the importance of storytelling; there are countless academic and personal benefits that come from engaging with creative writing. Besides from helping to foster a more active imagination, storytelling helps people develop the skills that are essential in everyday life: problem-solving abilities, communication, resilience and critical-thinking skills. Significantly, storytelling is also proven to help children foster empathy and emotional intelligence, as words bridge the gap between themselves and others, helping them to understand different perspectives and experiences. All in all, storytelling helps to nurture the skills our girls need to thrive in life, and at UAI we feel passionate about keeping this form of expression alive.

This coming week, we'll be embracing National Storytelling Week in school. As well as library lessons being used discuss all things storytelling and give our girls the chance to dream up their own tales, our school librarian is running a **short story competition** open to the whole school! But look behind this all, the artist's view, the victims,

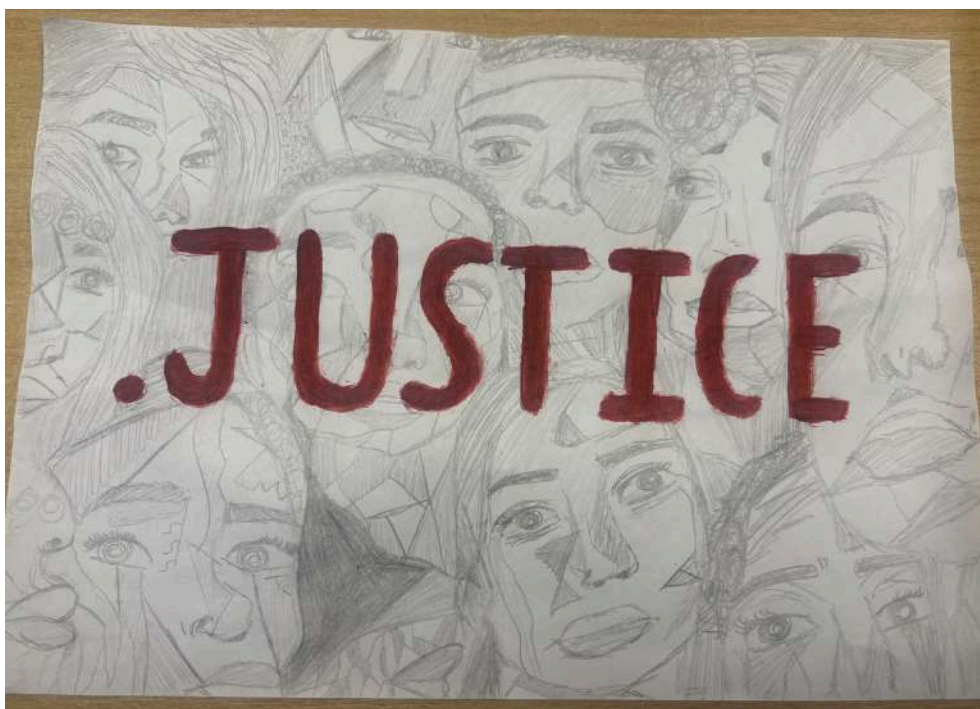
The finest brushstroke with a scream of anger,

Did you know...just registering your daughter for Free School Meals means that our school gets extra money!!

You can register your daughter for Free School Meals if you receive any of these benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
 - Income Support
 - Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
 - Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
 - The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

If you want your daughter to have a free, healthy meal at lunchtime that's great – she will get a free meal (saving you more than £400 per year!). There is NO stigma attached and no one will know because we operate a cashless payment system in our Dining Hall.

If you qualify but don't want your daughter to have Free School Meals, please still register as the school will get additional funding. Your daughter can still continue to have her packed lunch as normal!

To apply please complete the on-line Free School Meals application on the Redbridge.gov.uk website. You can apply regardless of which borough you live in because your daughter attends a school in Redbridge. It is a simple 1-page form, so don't delay, apply today!!

It is important to note that:

- Taking the meal is recommended but not compulsory
- Your daughter may receive additional help as a result of being registered, for example, help with the cost of music lessons or school trips
- No one will know and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming
- Registering your daughter for Free School Meals will bring in more money to our school.
