



#### Extra-Curricular - St John Ambulance Cadets



### Science Club Week 12: Making Bath Bombs!





#### Piloting Design Thinking Activities with the V&A Young Museum

With the announcement on Wednesday of the new V&A Young Museum's official opening on the 1<sup>st</sup> July, we had the wonderful opportunity of welcoming Kirsty Sullivan and her team to take over our lessons for two days last week. It offered a rare chance for students to work with different designers, Lea Jagendorf and Julia Josephson who designed and delivered a variety of briefs suited for our Year 7, 8, 9, and 10's.

Included was prototyping and testing out resources in readiness for the educational activities that will be offered to schools when school children visit in September. The themes were based around playground and shelter designs that could be folded down and put back up quickly. Some tasks required no sketching, and sometimes students having to go straight into 3D modelling, proved challenging with limited materials. Other challenges included the ever-popular shoe design activity and how to encourage people to use the stairs instead of escalators. For the participating classes, we had an enjoyable eclectic range of activities with the V&A two days in-residence. We want to say a huge thank you to Kirsty and the rest of the team, our girls really enjoyed the sessions and as word got out we had many wanting to know why they were not included. 












I liked the way the visitors came to teach us about their work of design, the best part was when we made the shoes in pairs with different craft stuff like ribbons, straws, clay and more.



Did you know...just registering your daughter for Free School Meals means

#### that our school gets extra money!!

You can register your daughter for Free School Meals if you receive any of these benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less that £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get Free School Meals.

If you want your daughter to have a free, healthy meal at lunchtime that's great – she will get a free meal (saving you more than £400 per year!). There is NO stigma attached and no one will know because we operate a cashless payment system in our Dining Hall.

If you qualify but don't want your daughter to have Free School Meals, please still register as the school will get additional funding. Your daughter can still continue to have her packed lunch as normal!

To apply please complete the on-line Free School Meals application on the Redbridge.gov.uk website. You can apply regardless of which borough you live in because your daughter attends a school in Redbridge. It is a simple 1-page form, so don't delay, apply today!!

#### It is important to note that:

- Taking the meal is recommended but not compulsory
- Your daughter may receive additional help as a result of being registered, for example, help with the cost of music lessons or school trips
- No one will know and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming
- Registering your daughter for Free School Meals will bring in more money to our school.


















# SHARING SUNDAY'S GOSPEL WITH PARENTS & FAMILIES

Each year on the second Sunday of Lent, we read about Jesus' transfiguration. Often in the Bible, mountains are described as sacred places. The encounter in this Sunday's Gospel took place on the holy Mountain - Mt Tabor.

This was a sacred moment and an encouragement to the three disciples too. For the first time they received a glimpse of the awesome divinity of Jesus and also a hint of the heavenly glory which God had prepared for them too.

#### Wednesday 1st March 2023

The change in the way Jesus looked (his transfiguration), the extraordinary appearance of Moses and Elijah (who had both died many years earlier) and hearing the Father's voice from heaven, would have encouraged Jesus in his mission - to spread the Good News.




#### Our Special Time Together

#### Wednesday's ENCOURAGEMENT Loving God & Each Other


"With God we can do great things. Jesus is always ready to encourage and support us." Pope Francis
