Social Media Use

Unfortunately, we occasionally experience problems in school that stem from students' inappropriate use of social media outside of school. Naturally, where these issues spill over into school life, we will always do our very best to resolve them and support students as necessary. I recently received complaints from several students about unpleasant exchanges on social media where the perpetrator was using a fake account and thus protecting their identity. Whilst I have informed our safer schools' officer about this incident, there is very little that we can do about such activity in practical terms. Whilst we continue to educate the girls about staying safe online and the appropriate use of electronic devices, close monitoring of social media and online activity at home is essential to keeping children safe. I would strongly encourage you to monitor your daughter's online activities in order to safeguard them from the unpleasant and sometimes dangerous aspects of social media.

Music News

Private Instrumental Lessons at UAI – Notice for Parents

Please remember that in order to secure your daughter's music lessons, payment needs to be made directly to the instrumental tutor at the start of the term before your daughter's first lesson. Our Visiting Music Teachers normally start their lessons on the first week of term, however, they are unable to start if there is a delay in receiving payments.

Cancellations:

At least one week's notice should be given to the tutor if a student is unable to attend a lesson which has already been paid for, although this is down to the discretion of the tutor. If a student is absent through illness and has not given the appropriate notice (*as above*), the lesson will still be charged. If a tutor is absent, the lesson will be postponed or parents/carers can request a refund. Notice of proposed termination of lessons must be sent in writing by parent/guardian to the <u>music tutor</u>

and Head of Music, Ms Deller. You must give 6 weeks' notice to terminate lessons.

Timetables:

Please ask your daughter to make a note of her lesson time in her school diary. Times for KS3 will be different each week as we move to a rotating timetable so that students are not missing the same lesson on consecutive weeks. The onus will be on your daughter to liaise with her subject teacher to catch up with missed work and to be punctual for her tuition.

Organisation and commitment:

It is in the best interest of the student, parent/guardian, and music tutor that students are on time to lessons and practice in between each lesson. Practice is very important in acquiring a new skill, and master the skill, and will ensure students get the most out of their lessons. Please discuss the commitment and responsibility that your daughter is undertaking in learning an instrument. We expect that you will support the school as we encourage all young musicians to regularly attend weekly ensemble rehearsals and contribute to our cultural life by participating in extra-curricular performances and liturgical events.

This week for Science club the girls attended a trip to the Science museum. The trip was so much fun and the feedback from the girls was excellent:



Are you entitled? Did you know...just registering your daughter for Free School Meals means

<u>that our school gets extra money!!</u>

You can register your daughter for Free School Meals if you receive any of these benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less that £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get Free School Meals.

If you want your daughter to have a free, healthy meal at lunchtime that's great – she will get a free meal (saving you more than £400 per year!). There is NO stigma attached and no one will know because we operate a cashless payment system in our Dining Hall.

If you qualify but don't want your daughter to have Free School Meals, please still register as the school will get additional funding. Your daughter can still continue to have her packed lunch as normal!

To apply please complete the on-line Free School Meals application on the Redbridge.gov.uk website. You can apply regardless of which borough you live in because your daughter attends a school in Redbridge. It is a simple 1-page form, so don't delay, apply today!!

It is important to note that:

- Taking the meal is recommended but not compulsory
- Your daughter may receive additional help as a result of being registered, for example, help with the cost of music lessons or school trips
- No one will know and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming
- Registering your daughter for Free School Meals will bring in more money to our school.



Seeing Jesus coming towards him, John said, "Look, there is the lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world. This is the one I spoke of when I said, 'A man is coming after me who ranks before me

because he existed before me.' I did not know him myself, and yet it was to reveal him to Israel that I came baptising with water." John also declared, "I saw the Spirit coming down on him from heaven like a dove and resting on him. I did not know him myself, but he who sent me to baptise with water had said to me, 'The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and rest is the one who is going to baptise with the Holy Spirit.' Yes, I have seen and I am the witness that he is the Chosen One of God."



John the Baptist saw Jesus coming towards him and said, "Look, there is the lamb of God! He is the one who will take away the sin of the world. When I baptised him, I saw the Spirit come down on him from heaven like a dove. God had said to me, 'One day, when you are baptising with water, you will see the Spirit come down and rest upon a certain man. He will be the one who will baptise people with the Holy Spirit.'" Then John said, "I saw this happen and I am the witness that Jesus is God's Chosen One."

What did John the Baptist say that he was the witness to? Which words stood out for you in this Gospel, and why? See the picture opposite. What does it make you think about?



Wednesday's WITNESS

John the Baptist witnessed to the truth about Jesus.

Ask your child what the word 'witness' means to them. Which wellknown people or saints does your child know who have been great witnesses for Jesus (e.g. Mary his mother, St Joseph, St Teresa of Calcutta, St David, St Patrick)? Who does your child know to be a great witness today (e.g. our present Pope - Francis, a family member, a priest, a teacher, a friend)? Who has recently brought the message of Jesus to your child at home, at school or in the parish?

Through our words and especially through our actions, we can be God's witnesses, through living our lives the way Jesus shows us. Choose a special way to be God's witnesses - sharing and showing love to everyone you meet this week.
