
Dear Parents/Guardians Headteacher's Headlines...

## Ursuline Student Profile - Leading for justice

This term we will focus on the value of not only living justly with one another but also leading, influencing, encouraging others to live justly in their daily lives with themselves and others. This important value is widely held by all peoples and in places, but too often, we are quick to point out when justice is missing, and sometimes slow to ensure justice is promoted. Pope Benedict wrote in his encyclical *Deus Caritas* (God is Love) 2005. "Building a just social and civil order, wherein each person receives what is his or her due," he writes, "is an essential task which every generation must take up anew."

As Christians it is our responsibility to try and make our world more just. We are reminded of Jesus' teaching in the Synagogue *"I am bringing the good news to the poor... to release the captives and to let the oppressed go free"* (Luke 4). We must be attentive to the needs of others and share our resources with anyone who needs

them. Fighting for justice is not something only rooted within the Christian Church or Bible. In fact, it is a worldwide initiative to fight for what individuals know is truly right. The girls will undertake study and debate about a variety of topics connected to social justice in RE lessons.

Social justice aims to grow the Kingdom of God on earth, here and now. Using our voice and influence to conquer injustice.





#### **Destiny Virtual Work Experience Programme - February 2023**

- Destiny is a free programme, funded by Countryside Partnerships and hosted by Springpod. It is open to all young people aged 14+/ Year 10+.
- It is an online work experience programme that young people can complete in their own time and includes 4 x live webinars with Countryside staff across a range of disciplines.
- The programme is aimed at providing young people with an introduction to a range of careers in the housebuilding/ real estate sector including development, technical, construction, sales and marketing and customer services.
- The Destiny programme should take 5 hours to complete online and, if young people enjoy the course and are interested in learning more, they can complete optional projects and express their interest to do further in-person work experience with Countryside Partnerships.
